

# SSOSPC Community Readiness Assessment Training

## Materials to Purchase and Transcription Ideas

### Video conferencing (for phone-based or video interviews with community key informants)

- If interviews can't be conducted in-person, video conferencing can be helpful.
- Many services and options and most have similar annual and per-month pricing.
- **Zoom is the preferred option for the SSOSPC initiative.**
- If you are establishing a Zoom account, ensure meetings can last for 60 minutes or more (the free account only allows up to 40 minutes)

**Digital Recorder (if conducting phone or in-person interviews)**

- We recommend the Olympus brand and Olympus model WS-853 or higher.
- Olympus WS-853 retails for approximately \$71.00 on Amazon.com
- The model you purchase must allow you to transfer audio files off of the recorder in .wav or mp3 formats
- You will want the recorder to have a USB cable or integrated connection so that you can connect the recorder to your computer.



**Telephone pickup (if conducting phone interviews)**

- Needed for any telephone interviews you may conduct. We recommend Olympus model TP-8 at a cost of \$14.99 via Amazon.com
- Depending on the phone, may require an adapter



**Other supplies needed**

- A 5 pack of highlighters for scoring

## Transcription options for Community Readiness Interviews

1. Otter.ai ([www.otter.ai](http://www.otter.ai))
  - a. Artificial intelligence-based web transcription
  - b. PIRE and Ohio University have used it with good results (few errors)
  - c. Very quick turnaround
  - d. Interfaces directly with Zoom audio files
  - e. \$9.99/month
2. Court reporters
  - a. Strong transcription skills
  - b. Local--located in your community or in a neighboring community
  - c. May be low or no cost
  - d. Availability/time may be a challenge
3. Agency transcriptionists
  - a. Some human service agencies have staff trained in transcription
  - b. Local--located in your community or in a neighboring community
  - c. May be low or no cost
  - d. Availability/time may be a challenge
4. Transcription services
  - a. Not local
  - b. Specialized experience
  - c. Very quick turnaround
  - d. Likely to be higher-cost than local options or otter.ai
5. Other options
  - a. You may have other possibilities in your community (college students, interns, etc.)
  - b. Key consideration is to ensure that the resource you use can provide an accurate transcript on your
